Sea Scout Ship 5510 -- Chippewa Lake

Friends of Medina County Parks, Inc. has partnered with the Chippewa Lake Sailing Club to sponsor the BSA Sea Scout unit at Chippewa Lake. Sea Scouting is a part of the Boy Scouts of America Venturing program that offers young men and women ages 14-21 co-ed activities and programs to promote character, leadership, citizenship and physical fitness. Although new to Medina County, the Sea Scouts was established in 1912.

The Sea Scout program involves young adults in water sports activities including sailing, canoeing, water skiing, scuba diving, snorkeling, seamanship, whitewater rafting, the shooting sports, climbing, camping, safe boating practices, and community service. Ship 5510 has monthly meetings and activities year-round. From May to October, the ship meets weekly at the Chippewa Lake Sailing Club. The ship provides boating, water safety, and training programs as part of its community service. These programs are usually advertised by Medina County Park District. Ask your friends, "What did you do last weekend?"
