Registration is online at the park district's website: www.medinacountyparks.com. Click on the *Programs/Activities* tab, then on *Program Registration*.

- These three-day camps are for kids ages 7 to 12, NO EXCEPTIONS.
- Only one scheduled camp week per child is permitted.
- Registration deadlines vary according to the camp (see back page for details).
- The FEE IS \$10 PER CHILD; please make checks payable to Medina County Park District. If you sign up more than one child, send one check for the total amount due.
- Include a copy of your receipt with your payment. Payment must be received by the specific camp DUE DATE, or your registration will be canceled.
- Please fill out and return the emergency contact form with your payment. The form will be attached to your confirmation email.
- If you need to cancel a registration or have questions, please call the park office at 330-722-9364 or 1-844-722-9364, Monday through Friday, from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
- Cancellations made after payment due dates are not eligible for refunds. All eligible refunds will be processed after August 1.

What to Wear

Life in a Stream

Come along on an adventure to discover the salamanders, frogs, crayfish, and insects found in a woodland stream. Footwear appropriate for shallow wading is required.

All About Muck

Pond muck is full of all sorts of creatures. Come see how many you can find as we search through muck to discover just what lives beneath the surface of a pond.

Butterflies

Learn about and catch these brightly colored marvels of nature. In the meadow, we'll search for everything butterfly related, from crawling caterpillars to winged beauties. We will be walking through tall grass so wear long pants.

We may not always see the animals that live in our parks, but one way we can tell they're here is by the scat they leave behind. Find out why different animals' scat looks different and learn to identify some of the most common types. Then take a hike and test your skills along the trail.
